Friends make it happen!



Here Prof. Dr. Douglas Rutt, who organized the conference presents a colourful cake amidst songs of well wishing. As teacher for New Testament at the LTS Tswaedi was one its two delegates at this conference, which has taken place every 3 years since 2000 - previously also in Leriba, South Africa.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans

Prof. Dr. John Nordling from Concordia Theological Seminary Ft.Wayne [Indiana] taught New Testament theology in the 2nd Quarter of the LTS. During this three week spell - the third in as many years - Prof. Nordling taught the students of the theological main course the proceedings of New Testament exegesis and introducing them into the heart and centre of St. Paul's theology. At the big junctions in Church History it was this epistle of St. Paul that played a critical role. Think of St. Augustine, Dr. Martin Luther and also Karl Barth! Obviously three weeks is a very brief time to get into the profound depths of this fundamental letter of evangelical and Christian theology. However the hope that some students will develop a taste for serious thought and holy practice does not cease so easily. Prof. Nordling added to his own workload by teaching advanced Greek and basic Latin to enthusiastic students. He again presented a paper at the University of Pretoria and even though it was very early in the morning, he was surprised by an eager audience who were out to hear more from this dedicated teacher of the Lutheran Church.





LCSEA Church Council at LTS

Meeting in St. Athanasius at the LTS is very convenient for the Church Council of the Lutheran Church in Southern Africa. 
Meeting of the SA - Taskforce in SID
