Thank our good Lord and triune God 2016 was another successful year for the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Tshwane (Pretoria, South Africa).

It is already more than a decade since our Seminary opened for students from beyond our narrow confines in Southern Africa and thus for more than a decade it could house, teach and equip more than 20 students here per year and our missional task is far from over.

It looks as if our challenges are still growing exponentially. As scheduled the academic year began on the 1st of February and ended off after the final examinations and a joyful Thanksgiving celebration on the 11th November before most of our students left for home and a happy reunion with their families and churches in these summer and Christmas holidays.

In this past year 2016 we had 24 full-time students in the Bridging Course at LTS from Liberia, Ghana, Nigeria, Ethiopia, Zambia, DRC Congo and

South Africa plus more than 25 students in the distance education program offered at our Seminary in collaboration with the Lutheran Church Mekane Yesous Seminary in Addis Ababa. Added to our 5 doctoral students: Nkambule, Mntambo, Kainerugaba, Gbotoe and Machen that's 50+ students without the participants in ongoing training for vicars, pastors and laity at LTS.

We still rejoice at the successful completion of the PhD program by our candidates from Uganda, Liberia and Rwanda at the University of Pretoria (UP).

3 tutors (UP) continue to teach biblical languages and to prepare our students in academic skills. They prepared the students for the examinations at University level that all made the grade in the final examinations - except those, who were just too late to join the teaching program this year.

It was an obvious advantage of changing to English medium at our Seminary back in the day's of Enhlanhleri. Now the students could take advantage of all the theological literature published in this language and were no longer limited to translations in the vernacular. Obviously this came with a considerable price-tag besides the considerable disadvantage of having to study in a foreign language, which was different from the one in which the pastoral service would occur once the basic studies were done.

Above is a very basic list of books, which every one of our students at the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Tshwane (Pretoria, South Africa) receive during their course of studies. We get these books from the USA and thankfully the South Illinois District under president Timothy Scharr and also LCMS Operation International Missions (Rev. Dr. John Fale & Deaconess Grace Rao) are very helpful to provide the bulk of these books as the opportunity arises to carry them over here.

As every year we try to accommodate at least 10-15 new students on our Seminary campus. As we are

already pretty much occupied to capacity, we've got our work cut out to create space for more students. As it is, we've got more than enough applications for 2017. It is not just a matter of getting enough space, but also of providing the necessary books and working materials besides basic food and means of living.

Thanks to the gracious donation by Zion LC (CO) we've also been enabled to order 10 new laptops for our theological course. This will open up the option of electronic books too.
